

## The best college for history

The study of history is foundational to the liberal arts and the formation of the whole person. If you're looking for the best college for history, the answer is clear. PC offers the best quality and value in the U.S., according to [College Factual](#). In the history department at PC, you develop a critical understanding of the past and how it shapes the present. You also gain the necessary skills for graduate school and professional life. A degree in history opens career paths into law, education, government and various other fields.

Through coursework you'll research, analyze and communicate about history. You'll learn from professors who inspire excellence and encourage you to be an active, ethical and global citizen. Outside the classroom, experiences like studying abroad, researching in the field and volunteering in the community expand your learning opportunities.

## What You'll Study

As a history major, you gain wider perspectives on the ideas, events and problems that turn human civilizations. You also come away with real world skills – like problem solving and writing clear, evidence-based text. To ensure a broad-based liberal arts experience, history majors often minor in another field of study. You may even choose to pursue a double major, which enables you to gain mastery in more than one discipline.

History major requirements total 30 hours of coursework. The curriculum covers topics as diverse as medieval warfare and the 1960s. During the first two years you'll take general courses like American History I and II, and electives like African American History. Classes become more specialized during your junior and senior years. You'll complete a European course – like Medieval England and France – and one Area Studies course – like Modern Latin America. As a senior, you'll demonstrate skills in historical research, writing and presentation through a capstone project. If eligible, you may also conduct an honors project, which earns you marks of distinction on your transcript and diploma.

## Student Experiences

At PC, learning isn't confined to classrooms. No matter your major, you'll have opportunities to learn outside the classroom and away from campus.

- **Studying abroad.** PC offers programs through which you may study abroad for a summer, semester or an entire year. With destinations like Turkey, Nepal, China, Ireland, Egypt, Israel, and Spain, these immersive experiences connect you to rich and ancient cultures.
- **Summer Fellows Program.** You can work together with your professors on a summer project and receive a stipend for participating in the program.
- **Independent research.** You can conduct independent research during the regular academic year on a topic of your choice.
- **Internships.** An internship provides you with hands-on experience in a position where history is the focus. It can serve as a means to fulfill general education credit and/or as a means to explore career options.

In addition to these campuswide opportunities, other extracurricular activities are available to you as a history student.

- **Phi Alpha Theta Honor Society.** Established in 1921, this American honor society promotes the study of history and encourages research, teaching, publication, and exchanging ideas. PC's chapter of Phi Alpha Theta connects you with fellow history enthusiasts through academic and social events.
- **Service projects.** You and other history students have opportunities to benefit the community through service. Projects include beautification and repair at historic sites in the region.
- **Social events.** PC's history department hosts social events throughout the year that bring faculty and students together in a fun and informal setting.

## Career Outcomes

If you love history but wonder if there are enough jobs for history majors, there's no need to worry. The skills you acquire in completing your history degree translate well into multiple fields. A bachelor's or advanced degree in history qualifies you for work in a variety of sectors including museums, journalism, and government.

According to [PayScale](#), the average annual salary for an entry-level historian was \$44,365 in April 2019. And the [Center on Education and the Workforce](#) reports a median income of \$54,000 with a bachelor's in history.

Alumni from the history department at PC have pursued careers in law, the National Park Service and Foreign Service. They have become Fulbright Scholars and ministers. They have served in the U.S. Armed Forces and the Peace Corps.

No matter your major, PC's liberal arts education prepares you with problem-solving, critical thinking and other soft skills employers look for.
